#### Nootka Rose

Northwest heirloom from the San Juan Islands makes wonderful roasted garlic



#### Silver Rose

Its strong flavor is a favorite with gourmet cooks in France, Italy, and the U.S.

### Porcelain Hardneck Varieties

*Fat satiny bulbs each yield 4-5 huge, robustly flavored cloves.*



#### Georgian Crystal

Rich but mellow flavor, wonderful for eating raw in pesto and salads



#### Music

A popular baking garlic known for its huge, easy to peel cloves & robust flavor



#### Zemo

Hardy variety from the Republic of Georgia with high allicin content & robust, long-lasting flavor

### Artichoke Softneck Varieties

*Very easy to grow, with large bulbs that store well.*



#### Early Italian Purple

Vigorous, easy to grow variety with sweet mellow flavor



#### Inchelium

Mild but rich flavor, taste test winner, from Colville Indian Reservation



#### Oregon Blue
